

The Choice Is Ours

Janus, the Roman god of doorways, looked backwards at the old and forward into a new year. So do we. Probably every people has. So much of our looking ahead is spawned by our actions and words spoken just a few weeks ago.

Words...Words...Words. Their uses for better or worse are not new. Matthew had some words to say about words:

"If you grow a healthy tree, you'll pick healthy fruit. If you grow a diseased tree you'll pick worm-eaten fruit. The fruit tells you about the tree. You have minds like a snake pit! How do you suppose what you say is worth anything when you are so foul-mouthed. It's your heart, not the dictionary, that gives meaning to your words. Every one of these careless words is going to come back to haunt you. Words can be your salvation. Words can also be your damnation."

UCC minister, The Rev. Phiwa Langeni, writes in the UCC publication *New Earth*:

"Oh, how I wish Matthew's wisdom could have been more readily available to us, as children and even now as adults. If we really grasped how very powerful words are to our very existence—so powerful they can literally preserve or eliminate lives – we would have to reconsider almost everything we know.

"In place of political correctness, we can respect people and the language they use to refer to themselves (instead of language that erodes respect). Instead of tweets, status updates, and word-slinging comments, we can rehumanize the digital distance between our keyboards and people's screens on the other end.

"Give us wisdom to choose words that more powerfully reflect Love and Life. Amen."
