CHURCH SCHOOL: Forgive Often—Joseph and his family is a story of forgiveness. Reading it from Joseph's point of view brings understanding of how forgiveness works for the victim. The brothers receive forgiveness and the kindness Joseph delivers is a process of reconciliation. The brothers must apologize (offering to be Joseph's slaves), and Joseph must accept the apology (kindness). Without forgiveness, there cannot be reconciliation, nor love.
