THE SCRIPTURE LESSON

Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around him, they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?' He said to them, 'Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written,

"This people honors me with their lips,
but their hearts are far from me;
in vain do they worship me,
teaching human precepts as doctrines."

You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition.'

Then Jesus called the crowd again and said to them, 'Listen to me, all of you who have ears to hear, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that can defile by going in, but the things that come out are what defile.'

For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: obscenities, theft, murder, adultery, greed, wickedness, deceit, arrogance, envy, slander, pride, and foolishness. All these evil things come from within, and they are the source of your pollution.'

MASK POLICY: As the reopening committee continues to reassess the current COVID situation, we have come to the conclusion that we must return to mandatory mask wearing during our church service and during any other events or group meetings that are held in the church.

This conclusion is based on the most recent CDC guidelines that are now applicable to Hillsborough county which recently reached “sustained” levels of transmission. At this level, the recommendation is quite clear that all indoor activities require mask wearing of unvaccinated as well as vaccinated people. It is clear that both unvaccinated and vaccinated people can transmit the new delta variant at about the same degree. We feel strongly that we must, as a church and organization, do what we can to protect those who are at highest risk - children, unvaccinated and those with a compromised immune systems. We are truly sad we must return to this mandate, but we look forward to the time when we can meet together safely again.

This week’s Church School Reading: This week’s lesson is from the book of Mark:7, verses 1 -7, 14-15, 21-23. It was a tradition to always wash hands before eating, much like we do today. In this story, the disciples forgot to wash their hands before eating, and the Pharisees were horrified that Jesus would eat with them. Jesus reminded them that it was more important to have a “clean heart,” one that followed the teaching of God, and focus on helping others, rather than to worry about a little dirt on our hands. So this week, try to remember to be kind to others and not judge them if they have a little dirt on their hands or faces, because we are all children of God.
