



# **COVID-19 Protocols** (as of 4/2/2022)

Thank you for your ongoing patience as we navigate gathering as a community during this time of uncertainty. Here are the guidelines for in-person worship and using the church building:

- 1. Masking is optional throughout the church including worship, fellowship hour, church meetings, etc.
- 2. Social distancing is optional in worship. Those who still prefer to keep a social distance while seated in the pews are encouraged to use the "Social Distancing Cards" (found at the back of the sanctuary) to create personal space.
- 3. Friendship Registers are passed at the beginning of worship. We are no longer taking names at the door of the sanctuary.
- 4. Offering plates are passed during worship.
- 5. The Passing of the Peace will remain as it has been most recently: hug the one you're with and wave or share the "peace" sign with those around you.
- 6. The choir is singing during worship, and we have reintroduced hymns to the service.
- 7. During communion, bread and juice will be passed by the deacons throughout the congregation.
