THE SCRIPTURE LESSON

Luke 20:27-38

Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him and asked him a question, 'Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.'

Jesus said to them, 'Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed they cannot die any more, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.'

# **COVID-19 Protocols** (as of 4/2/2022)

Thank you for your ongoing patience as we navigate gathering as a community during this time of uncertainty. Here are the guidelines for in-person worship and using the church building:

- 1. Masking is optional throughout the church including worship, fellowship hour, church meetings, etc.
- Social distancing is optional in worship. Those who still prefer to keep a social distance while seated in the
  pews are encouraged to use the "Social Distancing Cards" (found at the back of the sanctuary) to create
  personal space.
- Friendship Registers are passed at the beginning of worship. We are no longer taking names at the door of the sanctuary.
- 4. Offering plates are passed during worship.
- 5. The Passing of the Peace will remain as it has been most recently: hug the one you're with and wave or share the "peace" sign with those around you.
- 6. The choir is singing during worship, and we have reintroduced hymns to the service.
- 7. During communion, bread and juice will be passed by the deacons throughout the congregation.
