Creative Worship Sunday, January 15 10:00 a.m. "Praying"

Mark your calendars! "Creative Worship" is on the third Sunday of the month! The theme for our church year is WHY WE WORSHIP - each month we'll focus on a different part of our worship service and explore why we include it and how it connects with our faith.

In January, our worship theme is "Praying" and this month our focus is on the Joys and Concerns that we lift up during worship. There are scripted prayers that we read together in worship - The Lord's Prayer, the Prayer of Invocation, the Prayer of Dedication - but we also make space for the prayers that we carry with us on Sunday morning, to share them with one another and with our God. We hope you can join us in-person or online!

What are you praying for in this New Year? For world peace? For an end to division between nations, neighbors, or family members? Perhaps you're praying for healing - for an illness or injury, for a relationship that has been broken, for a devastating loss that has left a hole in your life where a loved one used to be. Or perhaps you're praying for guidance. For a nudge or a sign or a roadmap that tells you which way you should turn, which direction you should go, which choice you should make. There are many reasons why we pray, and the objects of our prayer are just as varied. We pray for our world, we pray for our loved ones, we pray for ourselves.

If we don't have a regular habit of lifting up prayers on our own, because we don't have the time or because we're not sure how to even go about it, there's a weekly opportunity for us to pray in community - during our Sunday worship service. Prayer is woven throughout our worship service - in the Prayer of Invocation, the Lord's Prayer, the Pastoral Prayer, in the Prayer of Dedication after our offering, in the Prayer of Thanksgiving after we receive Communion, and in the Prayer of Confession that we include during the season of Lent. Reciting a familiar prayer from memory, or reading a scripted prayer printed in the Sunday bulletin, or listening to one of our pastors pray for us, is at times all the prayer we need. Yet in our worship service we also set aside a time for our unscripted prayers. For the joys and concerns that we each carry with us as we gather on Sunday

Understanding the New Testament

Wednesday, January 18 (No Class January 3) 10:00-11:30 a.m. on Zoom

Why do we have four Gospels? Why do they contradict each other at times? What was the purpose of Paul's letters? What is the Book of Revelation really about? Beginning this fall, we'll take a year-long look at the New Testament through this 24-part video lecture series produced by the Great Courses. We'll examine the original contexts of these writings and the people who wrote them, giving us a new perspective on these ancient texts. We'll watch the video together as a group and then have a discussion facilitated by Pastor Maureen. The class meets every first and third Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. on Zoom. (No class the first Wednesday in January.)

morning. We might fill out a prayer card to be read in worship, or submit a prayer to be shared only with our pastors, or choose to lift up a silent prayer to God - feeling strengthened, inspired, and comforted to do so by the presence of others doing the same.

During the month of January, as we move into the season of Epiphany, the church wide "Why We Worship" theme we're focusing on is "Praying." Our Small Group Ministry groups will discuss why and how we pray, our Church School children will take a closer look at the Lord's Prayer, and during our Creative Worship service (on January 15th) we'll explore the different kinds of prayer we include in worship and what we believe happens as a result of our prayers. Does God hear and respond to our prayers? How do we know? How do those around us respond? What do we do when our prayers go unanswered? Is there value to be found in giving voice to the prayer itself?

The word *epiphany* means "revelation" - and in the church, the season of Epiphany is when celebrate the many ways that God is revealed to us in the life of Jesus. But we might begin to think of prayer as a form of revelation as well. As we use prayer to reveal ourselves to God - our innermost thoughts, our persistent longings, our deepest hurts, our most fragile hopes. It's in our communal prayers that we reveal ours longing, hurts, and hopes to one another as well. It's in communal prayer that we're given an opportunity to be the presence of God for one another. As we're made aware of what others are carrying, and step in to give them a shoulder to lean on, or we make others aware of what we're carrying, so they might give us a shoulder to lean on as well.

Through all of this, our amazing God is at work. God's presence is revealed in the presence of others. In the helping hand, or the open heart, or the act of compassion that comes as a result of our prayers; in the prayers we lift up in community, and in the prayers that we share only with God. At times the response to our prayer is not the one we expect, or it doesn't come when we expect it, or we have something "revealed" to us that sends our prayer in an entirely different direction from where it began. God moves in mysterious ways, as the saying goes. I pray that you'll join us in January as we explore the mystery of God in prayer.

What is Small Group Ministry?

Small Group Ministry is where 8-10 people meet with the intention of establishing deeper connections with each other and with God.
