THE SCRIPTURE LESSON Matthew 5:21-37

'You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, "You shall not murder"; and "whoever murders shall be liable to judgement." But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgement; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, "You fool", you will be liable to the hell of fire. So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are on the way to court with him, or your accuser may hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. February 22 at 7:00 p.m.





Adult Education Event: A Second Hour with Dr. Gina Zurlo Sunday, February 19 after worship

On Sunday, February 19, Dr. Gina Zurlo, author of the book *Global Christianity: A Guide to the World's Largest Religion from Afghanistan to Zimbabwe*, will join us for a Second Hour presentation and discussion, in the vestry immediately after worship. Dr. Zurlo is Co-Director of the Center for the Study of Global Christianity at the Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in Hamilton, Massachusetts, and a research fellow at Boston University's Institute on Culture, Religion and World Affairs. She was named one of the BBC's most inspiring and influential women of 2019 for her work in quantifying religion worldwide. Dr. Zurlo will discuss the history, demographics and trends of global Christianity, and how these bear on worldwide issues today.

This event is an outgrowth of our church school program for the 5th, 6th, and 7th grades, which incorporates lessons about the spread of Christianity throughout the world. **Please join us for this exciting and educational event!**
