An Opportunity to GIVE Is An Opportunity to SERVE

Since 1940 the Woman's Association has held a Good Stuff Sale (formerly Rummage) and a Holiday Fair to raise funds for our church and charitable endeavors. Your shared help of time, talent and treasure has helped us to serve others.

These are some of the folks that you have helped:

- ❖ A great grandmother, who has clothed generations of her family.
- ❖ A neighbor Henry, who takes 10+ bags of clothing to Liberty House, a program for homeless veterans, male and female.
- ❖ A woman, who is still replacing things they lost in a house fire.
- ❖ A woman named Ruth, who gathers bags of clothing to be sent to the Lakota people in South Dakota.
- The Amherst Lions Club has shopped for coats and jackets for people in northern New Hampshire.
- We put together bags of baby, toddler and youth clothing for the Pass Along Project, an organization that supplies foster parents with clothing items needed to care for a child.
- We help with kitchen items for teens aging out of foster care and are on their own.
- We collect household items for the Bridges organization, the Home Starter program, and more.

In the past, boy scout troops have picked up our non-clothing items. This year, those items will go to Goodwill. Our World Service Team has arranged for an Ecosmith Recyclers bin to be placed at the Meeting Place, near the Amherst Post Office, for our leftover clothing and shoe donations. Proceeds from these donations will be used to supplement our church fundraising efforts.
