Singing

What makes your heart sing? It's telling that when we consider what moves us - our passions, our joys, our loves - we frame it in terms of song. We think of our very heart and soul singing out in delight. Music moves us in surprising ways. Unlike any other artform, it elicits emotion and memory and meaning that defy explanation. Hearing a particular melody, movement or hymn can instantly transport us back in time, cause tears to well up in our eyes, or string a connection between what we're wrestling with and the clarification we seek. For this reason, it's easy to understand why music has been a part of worship since human beings first turned their eyes and hearts to God. The book of Psalms that we have in our Bible is essentially a hymnal - a collection of songs that the ancient people of Israel sang to their God. It includes songs of praise, songs of lament, and songs of hope. When we bring our whole selves before God, we bring our emotions, our memories, our longings, and music helps us to express all three in ways that our well-crafted words and heart-felt prayers often can't.

This month our Creative Worship service (on May 21) focuses on the part of our service that is the most meaningful part of worship for many of us: the music. It may come as no surprise that the results of the Congregational Assessment survey (CAT) that we took prior to the pandemic revealed that our congregation has a strong love of music, with the majority of participants overwhelmingly agreeing with the statement, "The music at our church is outstanding in quality and appropriate in style to

our congregation." We are blessed to have an incredibly gifted and passionate music team here at CCA: our Music Director, Sara Phelps, our organist/pianist, Michael Havay, our Bell Choir Director, Wendy Valeri, who along with our Chancel Choir, Bell Choir, growing children's choir, gifted guest musicians, and all of you who lift your voices in worship, contribute to the joyful noise we offer up to God in worship. Our music team was instrumental (no pun intended) in keeping our worship alive during the pandemic, recording new pieces in their homes and searching through previously recorded pieces of our Chancel Choir to include in our online worship. Hearing those familiar voices and familiar tunes brought comfort to many as we worshiped apart from one another. But it also left us longing for the day when we would be back singing, ringing, and moving together in our sanctuary. For many of us, music is how we worship. While the other elements of worship are valued, without the music our hearts struggle to sing. Which is why we're devoting an entire Creative Worship service to celebrating the many ways we "sing out" to God.

May 21st is also New Member Sunday. We'll welcome some new and familiar faces as we publicly proclaim our commitment to walking together as a community of Christ. You may have noticed the increase in little ones coming up for our Children's Time during worship. 

Meet Wendy Valeri, Lifelong Bell Ringer

Wendy Valeri will be stepping down as Bell Choir Director at the end of this month, a position she has held for 13 years. But Wendy's participation as a bell ringer at our church began over four decades ago. She grew up in Amherst and is the third generation of her family to be a CCA member. Her maternal grandparents, Frank and Ruth Whaland, were members, as is her mother, Judi Dunbar.

Wendy began ringing bells when she joined the Children's Bell Choir at age nine. It was during rehearsals that she and the other choir members learned how to play the bells. At age thirteen Wendy volunteered to serve as the Director of the Youth Bell Choir, which was made up of eight or nine girls. Following her tenure in that position she took time off from ringing, but eventually joined the Adult Bell Choir over twenty years ago, then led by Kim Vars Whitehead. When Kim left in 2010, Wendy was named *Interim* Bell Choir Director, but the Interim designation was soon dropped.

As director of the choir, Wendy finds coordinating schedules the most challenging part of the position. The Bell Choir normally plays one Sunday a month. Wendy needs to select appropriate pieces and make sure that there will be enough ringers to play on that day. Pieces that require three octaves of bells need at least nine ringers, but there are also two octave pieces available that require fewer bells. Wendy not only directs the choir, but also often rings, sometimes ringing double bells, and occasionally she performs solos.

The COVID-19 epidemic temporarily suspended the Bell Choir performances at church, but it provided Wendy with a different creative outlet. She trucked the bells to her house and figured out how to record videos of herself playing solos, which she then emailed to Pastor Maureen, who included them in the pre-recorded services. During the pandemic Wendy communicated on Facebook with other bellringers who exchanged ideas and tips about recording performances. Since large bell choirs weren't able to play during COVID, Wendy found it helpful that bell composers were writing more solo and small choir pieces, which were in demand. As time went on, Wendy became more technically sophisticated and was able to record pieces from her home in Lyndeborough accompanied by our organist, Michael, who played the piano from his home in Hollis. While recording her performances at home she could edit out any mistakes that she made, so she found herself doing multiple takes to try to achieve perfection. When live performances resumed at church, Wendy experienced some performance anxiety at first, since she realized that if she made any mistakes, they couldn't be corrected with a retake. But she soon got over that concern.

An increased travel schedule at Wendy's job at Fidelity Investments as Director of Candidate Experience, where she leads a team of hiring managers, has caused Wendy to make the decision to resign as Bell Choir Director. Bell Choir member, Cheryl Gagne, will replace Wendy as Director. However, Wendy won't be leaving the bells altogether. She foresees herself as a "permanent sub" for the choir and hopes to be able to play more duets with Michael in the future.

Our church services have been enhanced for many years by the Bell Choir performances thanks to Wendy's talent, commitment and leadership.
