DID YOU KNOW? Long before the Europeans came ashore to settle in New England, the Native American Tribes in Southern New Hampshire were decimated by diseases brought ashore by fisherman. numbers dwindled, several tribes (the Souhegan, Nashua, Naticook, and Amoskeag Tribes) banded together with the Penacook Tribe to form a Confederacy. This new confederation was governed by a Chief named Passaconaway, who resided in what is now known as Concord, NH. This leader was reported to have many exceptional skills related to hunting and athleticism, so much so that his people believed his skills were magical! When Passaconaway realized the he would not be able to conquer the English settlers, he became a peacemaker, sharing parcels of land and skills that the Indigenous Peoples centuries. had honed over Passaconaway was eventually converted to Christianity and reportedly was a ..."sincere believer and never wavered from his faith".
