LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES

One: Over the last four Sundays of Advent we've lit four candles – for hope, for peace, for joy, for love. On this Christmas Eve we light all four again. With these candles we recognize the presence of God that surrounds and fills us at all times, and comes to us in a special way in the Christmas story. At the end of our service, we will light the center candle – the Christ Candle – to celebrate the birth of Jesus and welcome his light into the world.

(All four outer candles are lit.)

One: Please join us in the Prayer of Invocation and The Lord's Prayer:

Many: Life giving God, on this Christmas Eve we hear your call ringing in our ears. We see the light of stars and candles, leading the way. We long for a sign, an experience, to know you face to face. We come to be part of your story of love, liberation, healing, and grace. And we find all of this in a tiny baby, lying in a manger. We give thanks to you this night as we pray as Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.
